
## ABOUT THE REGION

The 495/MetroWest region consists of 36 cities and towns to the west of Boston.

495/MetroWest is home to roughly one in 10 Massachusetts residents.

The region's annual payroll is approximately \$28.5 billion.





The 495/MetroWest region grew by 49% between 1970 and 2020, compared with 24% for Massachusetts.

The region is a technology and life sciences hub.
Industry clusters with higher job concentration in the region than the state include IT and Analytics,
Biopharmaceuticals, and Medical Devices.

The region has consistently experienced higher growth, lower unemployment, higher educational attainment levels, and better-priced commercial and industrial real estate than the state.


# ABOUT STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

- More employers, strong wages, and low unemployment


That's why our region's business leaders remain bullish in the face of broader economic uncertainty.



### A HIGHLY SKILLED WORKFORCE

The 495/MetroWest region's population continues to reach higher levels of educational attainment when compared with the state - and Massachusetts is a highly-educated state.

- 61% of the region's workforce have a Bachelor's Degree or higher, compared to 45% statewide.
- 29% have a Graduate Degree, compared with 20% statewide.




# MORE AFFORDABLE COMMERCIAL & INDUSTRIAL REAL ESTATE

The 495/MetroWest region offers a significant pricing discount on commercial, industrial, and lab space when compared to the Boston and Cambridge markers – while still enjoying access to all the advantages that Metro Boston has to offer.

Of space currently for lease, 495/MetroWest Industrial space is a 36% discount from Boston/Cambridge, with a **63% discount on Office & Flex** space, and a **72% discount on BioTech & Lab Space**.

## GROWTH IN KEY INDUSTRIES






The 495/MetroWest region benefits from a strong presence of industry clusters that continued to perform strongly throughout the pandemic, including:

Growth in these industries has proven resilient in the face of economic turbulence.

### STRONG WAGES & JOBS


The region continues to attract new residents and families, and is an advantageous place to live: the region's unemployment has been consistently lower than the state's since 1990. **The region's annual payroll has grown to \$28.5 billion.** 

### OUR EMPLOYERS REMAIN BULLISH

The 495/MetroWest Partnership conducts an <u>annual survey of the</u> region's employers to gauge business confidence, intentions, and challenges.

In Spring 2023, despite low statewide business confidence in Massachusetts, a majority of 495/MetroWest employers expected their revenues to grow in the coming year.

Only 9% are contemplating a staffing reduction, while **41% expect to grow their staffing** presence in the region.
