REFLECTING AND LOOKING AHEAD BY MEREDITH HARRIS, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be in the forefront of our minds and we look towards the future communities across the world are grappling with what post-pandemic life will look like. What changes will stay? Will large corporations continue to primarily work from home? What will happen to those large office buildings?

I am happy to report that because of forward thinking and the proactive business friendly attitude that was established well before March of 2020, the City of Marlborough and the MEDC are well positioned for continued success in the years ahead. The life science industry and bio-manufacturing continue to grow in Massachusetts and Marlborough has an existing cluster of top-tier companies already operating in this space with the ability to move quickly and gain access to a variety of amenities, hotels, and much needed talent – proving that we are an attractive hub for this type of growth.

In 2021, companies such as Resilience Bio, BJ's and Aspen Aerogels chose Marlborough as their home. Resilience will bring 200 STEM related jobs to the city with an expansion at 92 Crowley Drive totaling 120K SF for their new state of the art R&D and manufacturing facility, whereas Aspen Aerogels is committed to leasing approximately 60K SF on Donald Lynch Blvd. bringing upwards of 60 jobs and new life to the area.

The MEDC continued to support small business and the hospitality industry as we navigate the ever-changing challenges the past two years have presented. We enhanced outdoor dining by providing 22 barrier covers for 5 restaurants in our downtown while also holding 70 ServeSafe / CPR training courses free of charge for our hotels and restaurant employees. We launched a Hidden Gems promotional video series as well as expanded on the Dine Local campaign to include all local service providers bringing more attention and direct engagement for our small business owners. Additionally, the MEDC worked with the city to secure a \$3M MassWorks Grant to help support revitalization efforts downtown.

The MEDC and the City of Marlborough celebrated 15 years of economic development achievements this year and we look forward to continuing our efforts in promoting Marlborough as the premier place to live, work, play and visit.






